At the early age of 14, Leonardo's father recognized his great talent in painting. Leonardo had painted the picture of a dragon (4) that looked so real that it actually scared his father when looking at it. Father and son made a journey to visit Andrea del Verrocchio, a well-known artist, where Leonardo began to study art.

By the age of 30, Leonardo began sketching and writing into diaries. <u>One of</u> the forms of writing that Leonardo used was "mirror writing" (5) (it means you write backwards, so that you can only read a message when you stand in

front of a mirror).

Most of Leonardo's major works of art have not been completed. (6) Probably he was never satisfied with what he did. Maybe he had so many thoughts and ideas that he wanted to write them all down and he didn't manage to finish them all. Both make sense, but no one really knows what the truth is.
